Indigenous Cultural Interpreter

JOB OVERVIEW

The Indigenous Cultural Program Interpreter (ICI) is responsible for facilitating Indigenous cultural learning experiences, primarily with elementary and secondary school student groups. Cheakamus Centre is also expanding workshop opportunities for post-secondary students and adult groups. Programs take place at Cheakamus Centre's Coast Salish longhouse, situated next to the Ch'iyákmesh (Cheakamus) River and surrounding 420 acre ecological preserve. While programs operate both indoors and outdoors, the overall experience is primarily outdoors, immersed in nature. The Cheakamus Centre is seeking staff members who are interested in Coast-Salish culture and who are excited about working with children and youth. This is a dynamic role that involves working in a close-knit team, with the goal of creating meaningful and enjoyable learning experiences for all.

PRIMARY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Meet or exceed the knowledge, skills and aptitudes for the Job Standard for program staff that includes, but is not limited to:

- Facilitate hands-on Indigenous cultural learning activities (e.g., cedar bark weaving, wood working, wool weaving, ethnobotany and hunting and fishing techniques).
- Assist with leading Indigenous cultural program experiences, using agreed upon cultural content in a meaningful, professional and interactive way (e.g., traditional welcome, family group activities, storytelling, drumming, etc.)
- Assist with preparation of supplies and facilities for cultural activities (e.g. fire starting, cedar bark and wool preparation) and clean up at the end of the day
- Ensure the cleanliness and safety of the longhouse facility and all associated buildings/structures (wood working area, fish camp, cooking areas etc.)
- Contribute to creating a safe and inclusive learning environment for all
- Collaborate with other departmental areas to ensure educational program delivery success
- Follow all Cheakamus Centre policies and procedures to ensure your safety and the safety of others
- Represent the best interests of Cheakamus Centre and by extension the North Vancouver School District in all external dealings
- Adhere to all human resources policies and procedures
- Assist with additional tasks as required

DESIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- Understanding of Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish) culture, or willingness to learn
- Ability to share Indigenous culture in a thoughtful, meaningful and engaging way
- Knowledge of local history, environment/ecology, and cultural practices
- Ability to work effectively independently and in a highly collaborative team environment
- Ability to problem solve using critical thinking skills
- Ability to stand for extended periods of time and can walk for distances of up to 1km
- Excellent communication, public speaking and program facilitation skills

The Indigenous Cultural Interpreter is employed by Listel Canada and reports to the Cultural Program Coordinator.

HOURS

This is a shift position based on program bookings that requires some flexibility. Most shifts occur during the day between 8:30am-4:30pm on weekdays, Monday – Friday. Preference will be given to candidates who are also available to work afternoon - evening shifts (1:00pm – 8:00pm), 2 or 3 days a week. Full-time or Part-time work available.

Starting wage is \$20 per hour.
