JOB OVERVIEW

Cheakamus Centre is looking for community-minded Indigenous Cultural Program Leaders who are passionate about sharing cultural teachings and helping others build strong connections to the land, culture, and one another. Programs take place at the Cheakamus Centre Longhouse. Situated next to the Ch'iyákmesh (Cheakamus) River and surrounding 165-hectare ecological preserve, the Longhouse provides an ideal setting for creating meaningful and enjoyable learning experiences for all. Cheakamus Centre is seeking staff members who are passionate about Coast-Salish culture and who enjoy working with children and youth in a land-based setting.

We recognize that cultural knowledge comes in many forms—whether passed down through family, learned through lived experience, or shared through community connection—and we welcome applications from diverse backgrounds.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Lead hands-on Indigenous cultural learning activities such as wool weaving, cedar bark weaving, woodworking, traditional games and ethnobotany walks
- Assist with leading indigenous cultural program experiences, using agreed upon cultural content in a meaningful, professional and interactive way (e.g., traditional welcomes, storytelling, drumming, traditional cooking)
- Assist with preparation of supplies and facilities for cultural program activities (e.g. fire starting, cedar bark and wool preparation, meal service set up) and clean up at the end of the day
- Contribute to creating a safe and inclusive learning environment for all
- Follow all Cheakamus Centre policies and procedures to ensure your safety and the safety of others
- Assist with additional support tasks as needed

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Understanding of Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish) culture, or willingness to learn
- Experience working with children and/or youth
- Desire to share Indigenous culture in a thoughtful, meaningful and engaging way
- Ability to work effectively independently and in a highly collaborative team environment
- Ability to work in an outdoor setting, to stand for extended periods of time and walk for distances of up to 1km
- Good communication, public speaking and program facilitation skills

QUALIFICATIONS

- Criminal Record Check, with Vulnerable Sector Screening
- Basic First Aid (OFA Level I) or willingness to obtain (Cheakamus Centre can help support this)
- Access to transportation or willingness to carpool (site is not accessible by public transportation)
