

## Indigenous Cultural Learning Workshop

Located in the heart of the Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish) Nation territory, Cheakamus Centre provides outstanding professional development workshops focusing on indigenous cultural learning. With an emphasis on making connections through direct experience and a strong sense of place, participants will be introduced to a series of traditional activities in and around a Coast Salish longhouse. Workshops are designed as holistic experiences aimed at providing authentic connections to the rich culture of the Skwxwú7mesh people. Educators will enhance their understanding and appreciation of how to more effectively align First Peoples Principles of Learning across a variety of content areas.

## **Activity Descriptions:**

<u>Cedar Work</u>: Practice your hand with traditional techniques and tools in working with cedar. Session includes a short interpretive walk to a cedar stand with culturally modified trees.

<u>Ethnobotany Walk</u>: Draw on indigenous teachings and local knowledge and explore the forest to learn about traditional medicines, food and resources.

<u>Wool Weaving</u>: Explore the traditional Coast Salish art of wool weaving, learning about the many applications of this important cultural practice.

Indigenous games: Learn to play several traditional games testing skill, strength and your competitive spirit.

<u>Connecting to Place</u>: Engage with First Nations Principles of Learning through an outdoor experiential learning lens.

Please note that all workshops will be facilitated in an outdoor learning environment with opportunities to access indoor or covered spaces, as required.
